Jubayr ibn Mut'im (may Allah be pleased with him) reported: I heard the Prophet (may Allah's peace and blessings be upon him) recite Sūrah At-Tūr during the Maghrib prayer. In this Hadīth, Jubayr (may Allah be pleased with him) heard the Prophet (may Allah's peace and blessings be upon him) recite Sūrat At-Tūr in the first two Rak'ahs of the Maghrib prayer, and that was when he came to free the captives after the battle of Badr. He embraced Islam after that.
