The Prophet (may Allāh's peace and blessings be upon him) informs that remembering Allāh Almighty with these noble phrases is better than the world and what it contains. The phrases are: Subhān Allāh (Glory be to Allāh): Exalting Allāh far above imperfections. Wa al-hamdulillāh (Praise be to Allāh): Praising Allāh by the attributes of perfection along with loving and extolling Him. Wa lā ilāha illa Allāh (There is no god but Allāh): None is truly worthy of worship except Allāh. Wa Allāhu akbar (Allāh is the Most Great): He is Greater and more Sublime than all else.

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
